Thus far, attendees have been small, but we're hoping that once the word is out, there will be more.

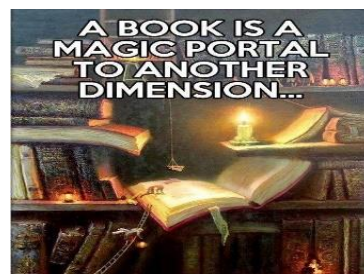
If you're curious to know which movies are showing, they are listed elsewhere in this newsletter.

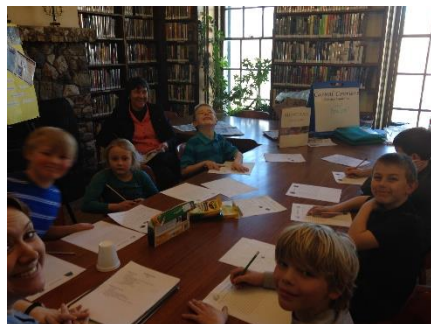




Alder School Library Education
