“The Montana Memory Project provides access to digital collections and items relating to Montana's cultural heritage and government. In part, these collections and items document the Montana experience. Access is free and open through the Internet. Many of these items are digitized copies of historic material, some items are contemporary. All serve as a resource for education, business, pleasure, and lifelong learning. This project is a statewide project of the Montana State Library in partnership with the Montana Historical Society Research Center.”

The Montana Memory Project is a great resource for people doing research on Montana history or for people who just want to browse through old photographs. In fact, during the workshop I managed to find pictures of my husband in his High School yearbook!

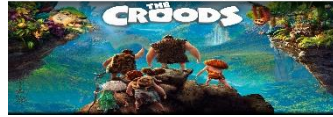
We have decided to begin the long process of digitizing our archival collection and submitting some items to the Montana Memory Project.
