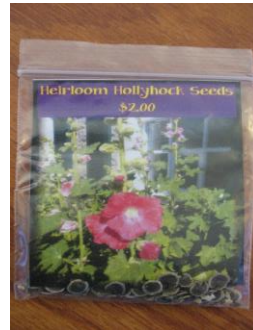

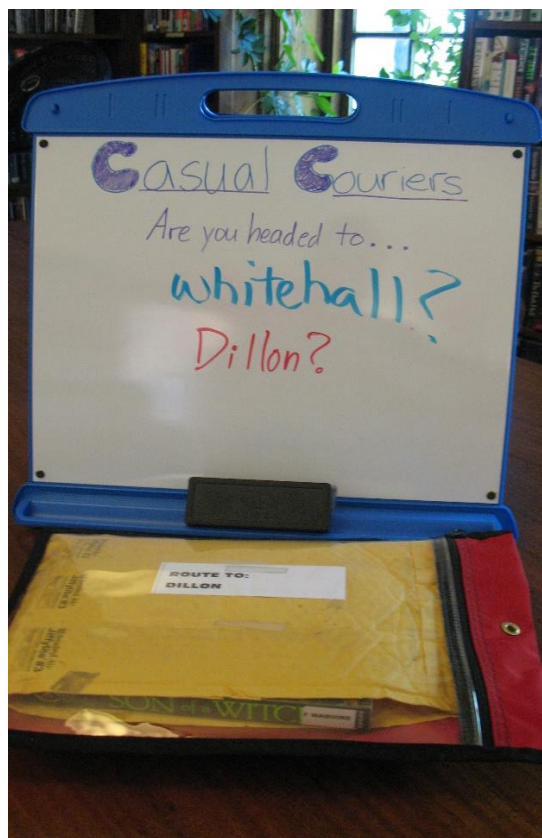

What is a Casual Courier?

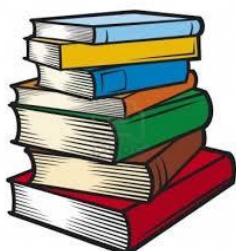
*The libraries in Madison County,

Casual Couriers are a great help!

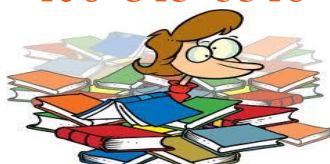


Book Stations

In a recent interview with *The Today Show*, 21-year-old Samantha Shannon, stated she was considered “odd” because she spent the majority of her teenage years hiding away, writing novels in her parent’s attic. A recent graduate from Oxford University, Shannon’s first published novel, *The Bone Season*, is making waves around the world and she is being called, “the next J.K. Rowling”. Bloomsbury Publishing gave her a six-figure book deal for the first three books in *The Bone Season* series and *The Imaginarium Studios* have already purchased the film rights.



The Bone Season follows the story of a clairvoyant heroine named Paige Mahoney, who rebels against a totalitarian government and its supernatural overlords in a dystopian futuristic London. In this society, clairvoyance has been outlawed, and those with the gift are sent off to a secret penal colony.

I am halfway through *The Bone Season* myself and it is definitely a “page-turner”.
